 - a. Nick: How far has discussion regarding opt-in models gotten?
 - i. Aiden: It's been proposed in the past, but athletics has not supported that model.
 - ii. Michael: Athletics actually was going to start the opt-in model for graduate students, but changed when fees were freezed due to COVID, so we have to start all over again.
 - b. Daniel: What were the increases of the athletics fee over the years?
 - Aiden: I don't know about that fee specifically. In general, fees increased on average \$11 during FY19-20, fees increased on average \$26 during FY18-19, and fees increased on average \$42 during FY17-18.
 - c. Nick: What was the average amount of fees people paid in 2000 compared to 2021?
 - i. Aiden: Full-time students paid \$964 in 2000 and \$1,955 in 2021, an increase of \$991.
